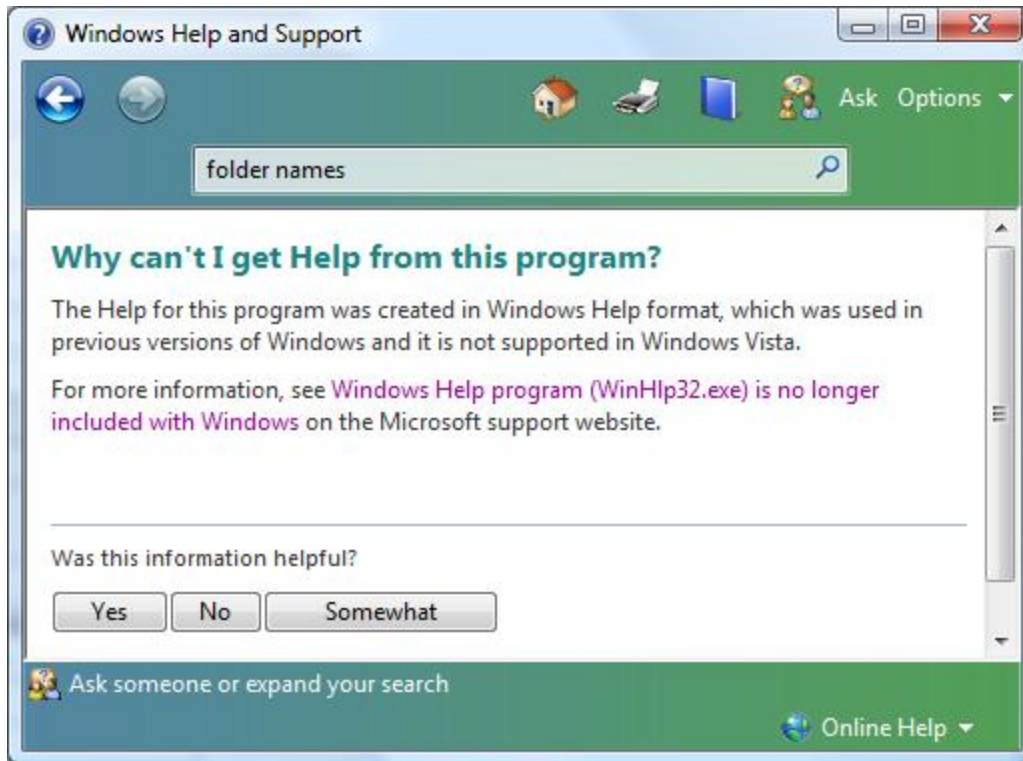

Problem: When you press F1 or click the Help icon in an SOS product running in Windows Vista, instead of displaying a help topic, your computer will display the following message:



Discussion: SOS applications use the traditional Windows Help system instead of the newer, HTML format help. The older help system components are not included with Windows Vista, so the SOS help topics cannot display.

Solution: There are so many current Windows applications that still use the older help system that Microsoft now provides a means to add this capability to an existing Vista installation.




1. Go to the following address on the Microsoft web site:

2. Follow the instructions displayed there.
3. After validating your copy of Windows Vista, the download page will display. Scroll down on that page and you will see two files listed, as shown below. The one we have highlighted below is the appropriate one for those users running the 32 bit version of Vista, which

includes most SOS customers. If you know that you are running the 64 bit version of Vista, then you should select the other one, which is not highlighted in our graphic.

4. Click the appropriate Download button, then select **Open** or **Run** when prompted. As usual, Vista will ask you for permission a time or two before proceeding with the installation.
